

Upgrading from NBCSA CSC™ Designation to NCSO®

CSC Received More than Three Years Before Making Application for the NCSO®

- Complete application (attached)
- Provide proof of up to date training (including First Aid)
- Attach proof of participation in COR® internal audit
- Attach proof of participation in inspections (copies of inspection reports)
- Attach proof of conducting a tool box meetings or safety presentation (copy of minutes)
- Submit a letter from your employer or detailed resume that demonstrates your industry experience (minimum of 3 years)
- Sign and attach NCSO® Code of Ethics.
- Include a processing fee of \$50.00 plus HST

Application must be received by NBCSA at the **Minimum of one month** prior to exam date.

Eligibility:

Once your application has been received and reviewed- NBCSA will notify you of your eligibility to write the National NCSO® exam

Designation:

Upon successful completion of the National exam (passing grade of 75% or better) Your NCSO® certificate will be mailed to you at your home address

Renewal of Designation

The NCSO® designation expires after three years. In order to renew your designation, you will be required to show proof of a COR® Company Audit in the last three years, copies of Toolbox Talk/Training Session you conducted and a Jobsite Inspection that you have participated in. In addition, you will need to proof of continuous education. If you fail to submit the documentation on time to NBCSA you will be required to re-write the NCSO® exam along with submission of documentation

National Construction Safety Officer (NCSO®)

The NCSO® shall:

1. Practice sound judgment.
2. Recognize professional limitations and competencies.
3. Practice the highest standards of honesty and integrity.
4. Represent themselves, their qualifications, and their experience accurately.
5. Promote and uphold the distinction of the safety profession.
6. Avoid conflicts of interest.
7. Protect confidential information and share only when legally obligated.
8. Respect dignity, diversity, human rights, and employment standards.
9. Continue professional growth and development.
10. Support the efforts of other safety practitioners.
