



## National Day of Mourning April, 28th 2023

The National Day of Mourning in Canada is observed on April 28th each year to remember and honor workers who have died, been injured, or suffered illnesses as a result of their work. The day was established by the Canadian Labour Congress in 1984 and is now recognized by the Canadian government as an official day of remembrance.

On this day, people across Canada hold ceremonies and events to remember those who have been impacted by workplace accidents and to raise awareness about the importance of workplace safety. They also pay tribute to the contributions and sacrifices of workers who have lost their lives or been injured on the job.

The National Day of Mourning is a solemn reminder that workplace safety should be a top priority for employers and governments. It serves as a call to action for all Canadians to work towards creating safe and healthy work environments for all workers.



**Project:** Hatheway Labour Monument - 'April 28 Day of Mourning Monument'

**Location:** W. Frank Hatheway Lily Lake Pavilion, Rockwood Park, Saint John, NB.

**The OSCO Construction Group** is proud to have donated their efforts towards the construction of this important labour monument. Warren Franklin Hatheway was a labour advocate who lived in Saint John, NB from 1850-1923. The administrators of the 'Hatheway Trust' consist of members of the Saint John District Labour Council, and the Building and Construction Trades. In conjunction with these administrators and the Saint John Horticultural Association, the Lily Lake Pavilion was restored, and renamed to honor Mr. Hatheway. The monument is located in front of the Pavilion and was unveiled on April 28, 2011, the National Day of Mourning in Canada, to commemorate workers who have been killed, injured, or suffered illness due to workplace related hazards and incidents.

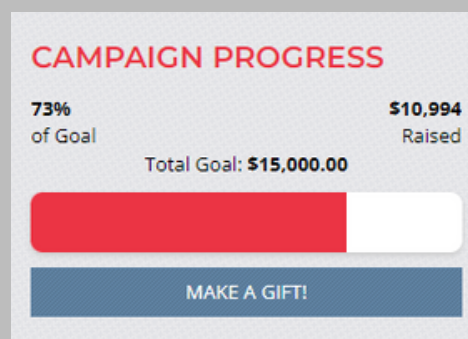

### Key Responsibilities:

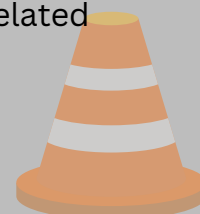
- Evaluate training and development needs in an ongoing basis and provide regular follow-up.

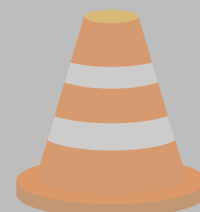
